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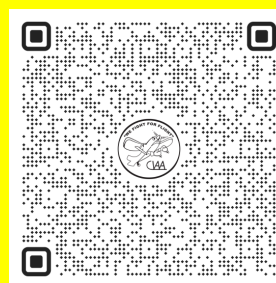

## Aileron and Jim's Safety Corner

### The One Bounce Rule

I teach what I call the 'one bounce rule,' which means you can try to correct the bounced landing only once. To be clear: You might need to go around after the first bounce. But in all cases, if the airplane bounces a second time, always go around. Risk increases with each bounce.

Bouncing can result from touching down with too much vertical speed. The landing gear flexes and throws the airplane back into the air. A bounce can also be the outcome of contacting the ground with too much forward speed. The airplane can skip back into the air if the wing is not stalled at touchdown.

One outcome from a bounce is an airplane that's airborne without sufficient energy to flare and the second impact is much harder. Another common mistake is the pilot making corrections too slowly, entering a pilot-induced oscillation that magnifies each error until control is lost or the landing gear is damaged. A third bounce outcome is a recovery that results in such a long landing that the airplane goes off the end of the runway. A fourth is a go-around so late the airplane collides with an obstacle while trying to climb away. If you're in danger of any of these after the first bounce, go around without a second attempt.

Bouncing happens to everyone every now and then. You can minimize how often it happens to you with good approach technique. Aim to be precisely on speed, on glide path to the touchdown spot, aligned with the runway with the centerline stripe between your main wheels, and with no sideways drift. My students will tell you, I'm always saying, "The rudders keeps the plane tracking straight down the runway and the ailerons correct the drift". If you're off on one or more of these variables—or even if you have final approach nailed, but a gust of wind upsets the balance—the airplane may bounce. GO AROUND!





## Aileron and Jim's Safety Corner (continued)

Landing an airplane smoothly at the planned touchdown spot requires every bit of judgment and precision a pilot has. No matter how well your last landing went, you have to work just as hard at it on the next landing.

Keep practicing those landings and fly often and fly safe,

So this beautiful time with the Mustang was coming to a close, and I could tell Grandma had been smitten by the experience of being so close to a real, fire-breathing genuine North American Aviation P-51 Mustang.....  
“Grandma, do you want a ride in something like this?”....  
“Well, yes, I think I would.” “OK, let me see what I can do, Grandma.”

A few years earlier I had heard about a privately-owned public-use airport north of San Francisco where a P-40 had been restored to flying condition and was offering rides. So I went on their website, North Bay Air Museum, and not only did they have the P-40 but they also had a P-51 Mustang available for rides. Grandpa needed to be consulted, and he was on board, so we made arrangements for a 30-minute Mustang ride, flying in a huge circle from takeoff from Schellville Airport over the hills to the north, over to the Pacific Ocean, down to just north of the Golden Gate Bridge and back to Schellville.

A briefing for Grandma, the pilot, Chris Prevost, would be flying on this beautiful fall day, and Grandpa, Grandson RC pilot, Sharon and I all jumped on this six-passenger golf cart to watch the takeoff. Then they turned left in a shallow climb until they were just a speck in the sky. But we could still hear the Merlin engine ever so faintly.

Now we had a half hour to wait so let's look at some of these antique aircraft based here...a gorgeous Blue and White Howard DGA along with a beautiful Navy N3N biplane in one hangar, a Cessna Bird Dog and Bucker Jungmeister in another hangar, a T-6, several beautiful Stearman biplanes and almost before we knew it the Mustang called in with “Mustang five miles east will be making a pass overhead to check for deer on the runway”. Here they come, the engine making that low even moan and the sun glinting off that aluminum. It seemed that all of five minutes had passed, but here they are landing and taxiing to parking, a 180-degree swing and the engine purrs smoothly as Chris runs it up to circulate the coolant before the shutdown. The canopy rolls back, and Grandma stands up and raises both arms in a victory salute!

Well, as Dean Martin used to say, “Memories are made of this!”

### **ATTENTION ALL CVAA MEMBERS**

#### **Important update on Chandler Airport Access Pin Codes**

Pin codes issued by Airports to CVAA members are for the sole purpose of accessing the field when attending the CVAA monthly meetings. They are going to be issued only to “active” CVAA members who attend the meetings. The Airports Department does check with CVAA on a regular basis to ensure they are issuing Pin Codes to active CVAA members only. In order for a CVAA member to be issued and maintain a Chandler Pin Code, that member must attend at least three (3) CVAA General Meetings per calendar year. If you are unable to attend at least three (3) CVAA General Meetings per year, you will be considered an inactive member, and your Pin Code will be discontinued. You can still attend the general meetings, but you will need to contact Jim Shamp so that he can escort you onto the field. To be considered an Active member, please be sure to sign in at the General Meetings and attend a minimum of three (3) meetings per year.
